10.30am (south side of the river).


There are picnic tables, some covered or bring a picnic rug or chairs.

Directions will be provided.



The next stop was the Lawrence Tavern. We continued on the Bruxner Highway until we came to the Pringles Way turn off, this road took us to Lawrence. On arrival at the Tavern, we were met by 4 more Members who travelled down the Pacific Highway and came over the Clarence River on the ferry. The Tavern was already very busy. We quickly ordered our meals. The very tasty large meals came out fairly promptly considering the large number of people there. A beautiful venue for lunch and a credit to the staff who managed the lunches very well.

We then moved on to the Lawrence Museum where we were met by Mrs Roz Jones, the Vice President and some of the other Volunteers. Roz had very kindly advertised our Car Clubs visit in the local newspapers. Roz gave us a run down on the history of the Museum and a brief history of Lawrence. The Museum is very extensive, a large selection of local historical items from old documents, a horse and cart, various tractors, a river boat, radio and telephone equipment, musical items, household items, NSW Fire Brigade carts and uniform, the Blacksmith shop, a milking shed, a reconstruction of an old cottage family cottage belonging to the family of Ram Chandra, the "Taipan Man". A small chapel exists in the Museum, including an altar, pews and a beautiful stained glass window moved from the Anglican Church when it closed. We spent quite a few hours at the Museum as did other visitors, some of whom also viewed our display of vehicles. The Lawrence Museum is a credit to the local volunteers, they have restored the old 2NR Radio station, both inside and out and have extended the buildings to include the large number of local exhibits. The Museum is certainly worth a visit, it is wheelchair and disabled friendly, but do allow plenty of time, a lot to see. All in all, an excellent day!!






