All articles appearing in "Coffs Splutter" are the sole responsibility of the author(s) as to matters of fact and veracity.


Doug Neeson, Fibreglass Artist Extraordinaire!

Ronis Dixon's father, Doug Neeson, was a very talented man. In this article I would like to outline a little of his history and some of the interesting motoring connections that form part of it.

I would like to sincerely thank Ronis for providing the photos and information contained here. Several years ago she put together a terrific display at the Coffs Harbour Collectors Fair, celebrating Doug's work and it received a lot of interest over that weekend.

Giant Murray Cod, Tocumwal NSW

This outsized Murray Cod measuring 21 feet in length, 7 feet in height and 5 feet across weighed 450 lbs and has an exterior made entirely of fibreglass reinforced plastic. The model was first sculptured in one piece is plaster and clay from which eight female moulds were cast. Fibreglass mouldings were then produced and jointed. A steel truss and strutting were used to stiffen the giant cod internally. Finally, a colouring was achieved by a spray technique using pigmented polymer resin. The finished article is a tribute to the versatile moulding characteristics of fibreglass reinforced plastics and great interest has been created in the area where the fish is a key tourist attraction for the town

General Motors Holden (GMH) GTR-X - 1969/70

An exciting motoring project that Doug was involved in was production of the body for a concept vehicle for Holden known as the GTR-X. Even today, motoring websites refer to the GTR-X as one of the most attractive Australian-built cars ever produced.


Writing in the Age Newspaper in 1970, motoring journalist, Christopher De Fraga reported that:

"Holden's new 123 m.p.h. fibreglass sports car drives as well as it looks. The low, wedge shaped body was styled in Melbourne and includes all necessary measures for safety necessary for Australia.....Driving the car around GMH's Lang Lang Proving Ground, I found it to be the best balanced car they have produced...At 105 m.p.h it remained rock-steady..."

The fibreglass body, in which Doug was closely involved in producing, meant that GMH could keep tooling costs at a minimum. The car was planned to be produced at a rate of 1,200 vehicles per year, offered to the public at a price of \$3,700.

Unfortunately only 6 cars were produced and it seems that only one has survived (in a museum in Melbourne) but there are rumours that other cars are also in existance.

1909 Renault "Do it yourself" Reproduction (the Cover Car)

Doug produced this reproduction of a 1909 Renault whilst working from a factory in Windale Rd, Doveton. He did so in partnership with his brother-in-law, Ralph Malcolm, and Ralph's sons Richard and Philip. The Renault was the first design and they hoped to produce other veteran car designs including a Model T Ford. The initial prototype cost \$13,000 to produce but the idea was to retail the cars either as a "do it yourself kit", sold for \$1,025, in which the customer supplied the chassis and assembled the kit themselves, or you could purchase a fully assembled vehicle for \$2,500. The fully assembled vehicles were to be sold throught the sole fanchise, Avondale Motors in Dandenong, Victoria. I wonder if any of these vehicles still survive?

- · Historic unmodified tractors remain eligible for HVS registration. There has been no change.
- The area code on the Certificate of Approved Operation does not restrict vehicle use.
 Vehicles can be used anywhere in NSW and on longer journeys interstate.
- Clubs are encouraged to distribute the Log Book Club Run Fact Sheet or share the link https://www.nsw.gov.au/sites/default/files/2022-12/historic%20and%20classic%20vehicles%20log%20book.pdf
 This fact sheet addresses many misconceptions about Logbook use and Club Runs.
- CHMC made a submission to TfNSW on retrofitting of seat belts to pre 1967 vehicles. This
 topic was extensively discussed at the recent Historic & Classic Car Industry Working
 Group meeting with all peak bodies. It is our premise that aftermarket seat belts should be
 installed in a manner that affords improved occupant safety and simplifies any required
 certification.

 standards.

 waiting for NRMA insurance's full explanation of what has caused a change in their policies
 on these two matters.


