

After a day's rest from driving Ron and I set off in the Porsche 911 to visit Richard and Jackie Mack who live in Norwich some 110 miles away. Richard is the Spares Officer of the Pre-1940 Triumph Motor Club with whom I have been corresponding about some vital parts for the Triumph Gloria restoration.

The Waze navigator faithfully guided us via highways and byways to our destination. We knew that we had found the right place when we spotted a magnificent Triumph Gloria in the driveway. Richard and Jackie greeted us warmly and invited us to have lunch with them. Richard showed us around his workshop which contained numerous machines which Richard uses to manufacture and repair parts for clients in need of his expertise. Richard also showed us his collection of classic motorcycles which he and Jackie have enjoyed for many years.

The required parts were waiting for us, so after a very nice lunch, Richard invited us for a ride in his Gloria which reminded me of my younger days when the Gloria was my everyday transportation. The return trip to Acton was as enjoyable as the outward journey as Ron guided the 911 down the motorways at a comfortable 80 mph and through the narrow streets back to his home.

The roads in the UK range from magnificent four-lane motorways to narrow country lanes which are not much wider than your car. The streets in suburbia are quite narrow as they were designed for horse-drawn carriages and the houses are close to the road. Both sides of most streets are lined with parked cars as very few houses have car accommodation. Consequently, the remaining road is only wide enough for one vehicle which makes passing rather tricky. Remarkably traffic normally proceeds without contact with parked vehicles. In fact, we did not witness any accidents anywhere during my stay or any evidence of road rage in spite of the hectic traffic movement. Instead, drivers were considerate and courteous in conditions which would make many Aussies freak out. I was pleased that Ron did all the driving as his insurance did not cover drivers over eighty. Such is the benefit of advancing age.

THE LADY DRIVER





Olive King



At the beginning of WW1 many women who knew how to drive volunteered to go overseas to serve as ambulance and truck drivers or mechanics. They delivered medical supplies, transported patients to hospitals and drove through artillery fire to retrieve the wounded from the front lines.

One such woman was Olive King who was born into a privileged family in Sydney. She had an interest in motoring including mechanics and rally driving. In England when war broke out, Olive went to Belgium with her own ambulance. In 1915 she was sent with her ambulance to France and then on to Serbia where a hospital was established near to the Greek border. Later she joined the Serbian army as a driver, working tirelessly, sleeping rough, often required to do mechanical repairs, and narrowly escaping capture on more than one occasion. Olive put her energy into the Girl Guides Association, after the war.

In America the National League for Women's Services had formed a Motor Corps division in anticipation of America entering the war. The Motor Corps was to provide auxiliary assistance to the armed services, through the Red Cross. No woman qualified to help was turned away from the Motor Corps. The Ford Motor Corporation donated 107 ambulances to the Red Cross, some directly to the Motor Corps.

Young Girl Scouts were earning their Automobiling badge by 1916 which included training in mechanics and first aid.

In 1916 the First Aid Nursing Yeomanry corps finally won the battle to become the first women ambulance convoy to work for the British army. That same year, no doubt for the same reason the FANY were sanctioned by the British (the need to free-up more men for the army), the Voluntary Aid Detachments motor ambulance convoy was established. In 1917 the British Women's Auxiliary corps was set up, including women drivers and mechanics.

On the front lines, women drivers played a vital role in keeping soldiers equipped with ammunition, as well as administering first aid.

Nobel Prize winner Marie Curie developed mobile radiology units, training 150 women to take x-rays on the battlefields to diagnose bullets, shrapnel and broken bones, before transporting the patient to hospital. Marie had never driven but set about learning quickly to enable herself to lead her fleet of 20 "Petites Curies" mobile x-ray vehicles to the front lines.
