SUNDAY 17TH SEPTEMBER, 2023, RUN TO GILGAI FOR THE HERITAGE WAR MEMORIAL 100TH ANNIVERSARY AND REDEDICATION COMMEMORATION CEREMONY.

The Bugler who played the Last Post was a young lady who did a wonderful job.

The monument was built by C.S. Thorley and Sons, with money donated by local families in the Gilgai area. It was dedicated on a cold, sleety, rainy day, how different today was! Many interesting photos and articles were on display in the Hall - the Family History group had done a great job, as well as those who had given their treasures for display on the day. The Red Cross provided food, tea, coffee and cold drinks.

It was a good day to meet up with many from away who had made the trip to Gilgai for this special event, which would not have been possible without Christina Schwanke and her helpers. Thank you to you all.

THE LADY DRIVER



Electric vehicles were popular with the ladies in the early 1900s as easy-starting, silent and clean town carriages limited only by the charge their batteries would hold. They were safe, slow and easily driven.

Britain's 'first' motorist, King Edward VII, had bought one for his wife, Queen Alexandra, who would drive it around their estate at Sandringham.

Although the range of the electric was limited (approximately 120 kms), it was very practical for use in the cities and for short runs into the countryside.

It was an ideal ladies' car since it could be started without cranking, women preferring the cleanliness, quietness and ease of control.
