President's Message

October was very busy for the committee and members who helped out in many different ways. An event on three of the four weekends. A huge commitment by many. Thank you so much for your support.

We had larger than expected number of visitors in the yard during the long weekend and on the Saturday of the Picnic in the Park. The visitors were more than impressed with the progress being made in the precinct and in particular the restoration work being done in the rolling stock shed.

Working bees have continued every Saturday and at the moment several days during the week.

- The track from Oberon to Hazelgrove has been sprayed for weeds.
- About a hundred sleepers have been sorted from the stockpile and had plates removed. They are ready for installation in the loop at Hazelgrove.
- An enormous amount of work has been done in the rolling stock shed on HLF854 and locomotive 7321. There are a few photos of the progress in this newsletter.

We just made the deadline for the next round of funding from the Community Building Project. Our focus was on improving the equipment that is used in track work. A battery operated dog spike puller and rail saw. The dog spike puller removes a spike in 3 to 7 seconds. Much easier and quicker than sledge hammer and pig's foot.

The opening of the railway line between Oberon and Tarana in October 1923 was celebrated with a picnic and the same thing happened on the centenary in October 2023.

The picnic this year was held in the Oberon Common and was combined with the occasional Cars and Coffee events run by the Oberon Taana Heritage Railway Inc (OTHR)

The weather was almost perfect and despite competition from several other events happening in the area on the same day a good crowd turned out to chat, grab a hotdog, drink some coffee from the Get Roasted coffee trailer, look at some classic cars and listen to some music from The Union.

One person who came in character was Greg Standen. "I think I'm the last living person who worked on the line when it was running," he said.

He wore his old uniform for the day, complete with the ribbons for length of service. "It will be wonderful to see the trains running again. It will take me back all those years when I was a part of it all".

OTHR Secretary Dave McMurray was there in two capacities, enthusiastically celebrating the railway's centenary and as part of the classic car collection.

"I've always loved cars and it's great to get the old things out of the shed and onto the road" he said.

"We had a bit of competition from other car shows today but enough turned up to make it an event.

"What's important about today is the celebration of the railway's centenary, and with the picnic and the open day at the station we are making sure that nobody forgets that the railway will be reopening soon."

OTHR have been celebrating the centenary throughout October. The next event is the big one - the Railway Ball at the Malachai Gilmore Hall on Saturday, October 28. It might be called a "ball" but it will be an old-time bush dance with music provided by The Nodding Thistles. Last year's ball was the social event of the year, and this year looks like being even better".

OTHR is seeking expressions of interest from members who have the necessary accreditation to drive 73 Class Locomotives or those who would like to learn/train. Importantly all accredited drivers will need to also volunteer in many of the other tasks required of OTHR.

We are also seeking interest for carriage attendants, guards, and station attendants.

Step 1: Your interest should be lodged with the President or Secretary at admin@othr.com.au

Important information about moving rolling stock:

Shunting in the yard will not be frequent but regular as movements are required. Typically shunting would occur in bringing rolling stock to the station for display at open days, special events and rallies.

Medicals:

The level of certification depends on your level of interest.

- Driver Level 1 medical certificate
 TMV operator Level 2 medical certificate.
- For all volunteers there is a site induction and further training depending on the type of volunteer assistance you wish to undertake.
- OTHR needs to comply with the guidelines of ONRSR – the Office of the National Rail Safety Regulator and other Laws either Federal or State.

Our Code

Oberon Tarana Heritage Railway Inc. (OTHR) is a not for profit, member-based organisation. We have a responsibility to strive to make informed, consistent, and ethical decisions.

Our code is a public statement that OTHR is committed to doing the right things the right way. Our code applies to all OTHR committee members and members.

We are proud of our culture, and understand it is continually shaped by the behaviours and attitudes demonstrated on a day-to-day basis by all our people.

Our code includes references to relevant OTHR requirements (OTHR policies and procedures) and other helpful tools and resources.

No code of conduct can ever cover every situation, OTHR relies on you to use sound judgement and speak up when you have questions or concerns. All committee members, members, volunteers, and employees of OTHR are representatives of OTHR and are expected to act responsibly and professionally.

As a representative of OTHR, you are expected to act in the best interests of OTHR and to conduct yourself in a manner that does not discredit:

- An individual team member, having regard to their position held within OTHR, or
- The reputation of OTHR.

Whenever here is conflict or a difference between an applicable legal requirement and Our Code, you must apply the strictest standard.

Our partners, and third parties, can also have a direct impact on the reputation of OTHR through their behaviours and actions. For this reason, we want to work with our partners to ensure that they share our commitment to safety, ethics, and compliance. We also expect and encourage all our contractors and their employees to act in a way that is consistent with Our Code. We will take appropriate measures where we believe they have not met our expectations or their contractual obligations.

I am your stunning sandstone bluffs; I am your limestone caves.

I am your long and winding roads to where you want to be;

I am your peaceful hide-away; I am your sanity; I am your pleasant soft green hills, that nature smiles upon;

I am your pine-clad forestry -I am your Oberon."
